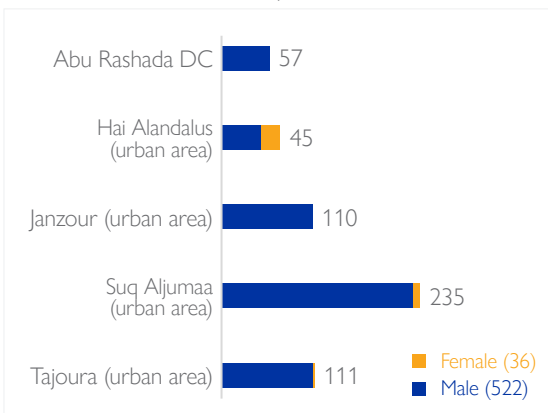

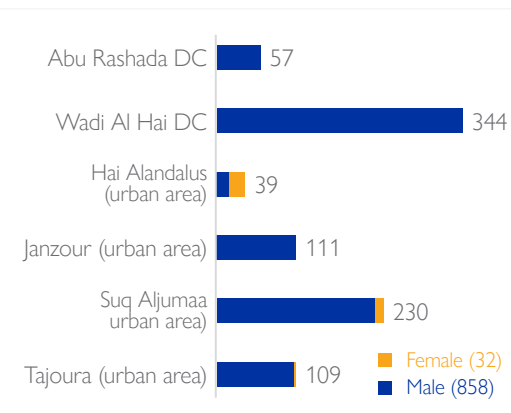


As part of the Libyan national COVID-19 vaccination campaign led by the Libyan National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), IOM conducted the awareness raising sessions on COVID-19 vaccines with a total of 558 adult migrants in one detention centre and community settings in four Municipalities during the fourth week. Trained IOM community mobilizers, accompanied by medical teams provided the migrants and detention centre staff with critical information on COVID-19 vaccines, including its importance, dosage, side effects and addressed questions and concerns related to the vaccination processes.

Gender disaggregation of migrants attending C-19 awareness sessions by location.

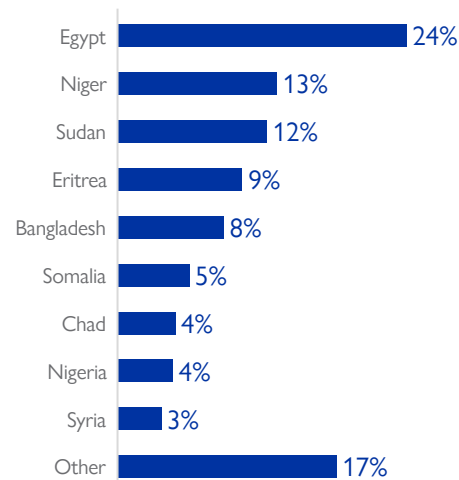


Gender disaggregation of migrants vaccinated by location.

Country of origin disaggregation for migrants vaccinated



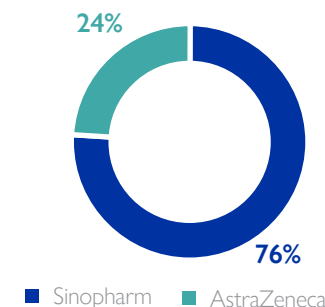

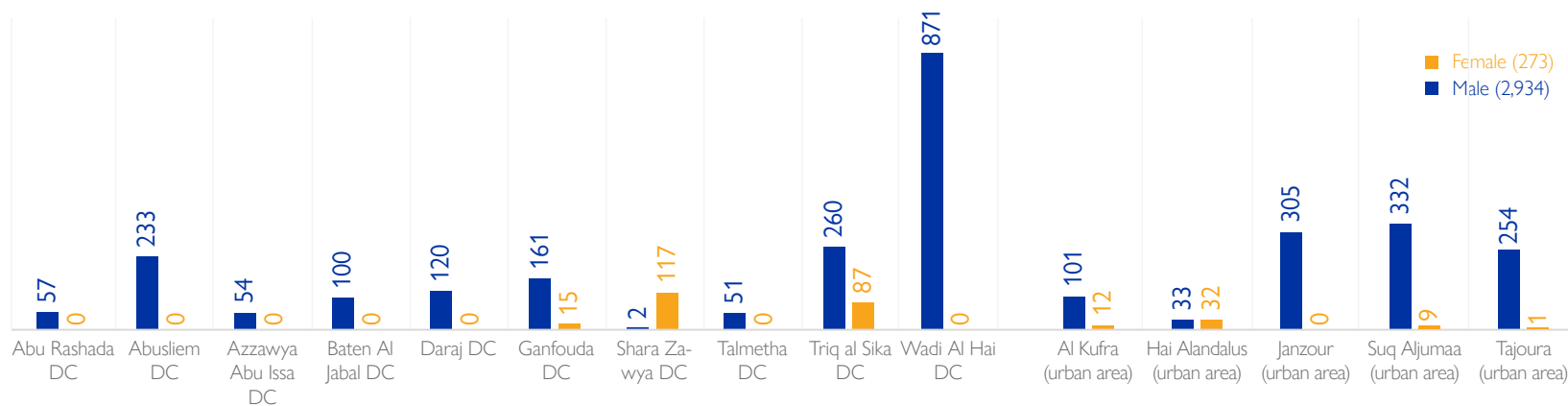

Vaccines provided\*



By the end of the fourth week, a total of 3,207 migrants (273 females and 2,934 males) have received either Sinopharm or AstraZeneca vaccines, out of which, 112 migrants (3%) have received two doses and are fully vaccinated (including the migrants who received the first dose before 3 October 2021). Vaccines were provided and administered by NCDC.
