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DISCLAIMER

Data presented in this document are representative of the individuals captured at the flow monitoring points during the timeframe indicated. Data should not be generalised and do not represent a full picture of inter and intra-regional migration, but rather of migration flows at the specific locations monitored. For example, while IOM aims to establish flow monitoring points at locations with high transit flows (based on information from informed stakeholders), flows are fluid and specific locations will provide an incomplete picture. The monitoring of flows in an assessed location should not lead to assumptions about flows in a non-assessed location or area without monitoring points.

Migrants adjust their routes according to opportunities and obstacles they encounter along their journey. Their intended transit and destination locations are often subject to change. This renders the systematic assessment of their mobility throughout the region complex.

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NOTE: The ** symbol next to section titles denotes that multiple answers were possible, so percentages may add up to more than 100%.

During August and September, Flow Monitoring Registry (FMR) was conducted 5 days a week instead of 6 days a week due to COVID-19 related measures.

*Flow monitoring data was not collected at the Humera flow montoring point in the month of October due to conflict in Tigray region.

**Migrants who did not give their consent to be interviewed and migrants who have participated in the survey before were thanked and the interviews were discontinued.

Flow Monitoring is one of the four components of IOM's Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM), a system that tracks and monitors displacement and population mobility. Flow Monitoring generally relies on two tools, (i) Flow Monitoring Registry (FMR), which observes migration flows and produces quantitative, observational data based on groups arriving or departing together and (ii) Flow Monitoring Survey (FMS) which produces qualitative data on intentions and profiles of individuals.

Both exercises are conducted at Flow Monitoring Points (FMPs), which are often major transport hubs or key border crossing points of high mobility, identified through extensive consultation with key informants. These key informants are often government officials, local community leaders, and humanitarian partners who have widespread knowledge about population mobility in their respective locations.

Flow Monitoring Survey data was collected once

a week from 1 August to 31 October 2020 by trained enumerators and supervised by designated field staff. It is important to note that this methodology allows for regular information on trends along or within a specific network of points that track a particular migratory route. However, the restricted geographic coverage, time constraint and self-reported nature of responses all constitute limitations to the methodology, which does not provide representative data but rather an indication of trends.

The findings in this report are reflective of data collected from 1 August to 31 October 2020. During this period, a total of 28,980 movements were observed through FMR, and 1,946 migrants were approached to take part in the FMS. However, of those approached, 22 had already participated, 1 was not sure if they had participated before and 12 respondents did not consent to being interviewed, bringing the sample size to 1,911 respondents. Children below the age of 14 years old were not asked to participate in the survey.



Number of migrants surveyed




Figure 1: Number of migrants surveyed at each Flow Monitoring Point.




Figure 2: Number of migrants surveyed each week from August to October 2020.

Figure 2 shows the number of migrants surveyed each week across the six FMPs throughout the reporting period. Note that changes in the number of surveyed migrants do not necessarily reflect broader migration trends. The number of migrants surveyed were lower during the months of August and October. This is likely due to movement restrictions that have been in place in response to containing COVID-19.

However, a high number of surveys were answered during the third and fourth weeks of September. Note that there is a positive correlation between the number of flows captured through the Flow Monitoring Registry tool and the number of surveys answered through the Flow Monitoring Survey tool.









Top 5 Most Reported Highest Levels of Education of Migrants




The most common level of education reportedly obtained by respondents was primary school (42.3%). The second most reported education level was lower secondary school (22.6%). 6.7% of respondents reported receiving no education at all.

An estimated 91% of migrants are unemployed. while roughly 4% of migrants are either employed or self-employed.

Top 10 Main Profession/Occupation of Migrants Prior to Departure




Of the 441 migrants who reported their main occupation prior to departure, a majority are services and sales workers (115 individuals or 26.1%).



TRAVEL HISTORY

Country of Departure



A large majority of migrants reported leaving from Ethiopia (1,213 migrants or 63.5%), while 143 migrants intended to travel from Ethiopia to Somalia.

The second largest group consisted of 340 migrants (17.8%) who left Sudan. Of that figure, 104 migrants (30.6%) who departed from Sudan indicated that




143 migrants intended to travel from Ethiopia to Somalia.

Ethiopia was their intended final destination.

The third largest country of departure was Yemen where 176 migrants (9.2%) originated from. Of that number, 9 migrants (5.1%) cited Ethiopia as their intended final destination.

Country of Intended Final Destination*






The majority of migrants that reported a country of intended final destination reported Sudan as the country of intended final destination, followed by Ethiopia (177 migrants).


Reasons for the Journey**



74.5% (1,424 migrants) cited economic reasons as the main reason for embarking on their journey

The majority of movements were driven/motivated by economic reasons (74.5% or 1,424 migrants), followed by marriage, family reunification or family formation (12.3% or 235 migrants).


Reasons for movement by Route**



Economic reasons was the main motivator for undertaking journeys. This is particularly the case for migrants traveling along both the Eastern and Southern routes where 100% of migrants cited economic reasons as the main motivator for travel. Of the total migrants tracked, on the Horn of Africa


Route, 54.6% cited economic reasons, as well as family reunification (29.9%), other (1.8%), access to services (0.4%), war and conflict (0.44%) and targeted violence or persecution (0.2%). Family reunification was the overall second most reported reason for traveling.





INTENTIONS

Reasons for Choosing Destination Country**



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When asked about the reason behind the choice of their destination country, a total of 1,172 migrants (50%) mentioned job opportunities as the main reason. 444 migrants (19%) cited that they were returning to their home countries. In addition, 313 migrants (13.3%) reported following their friends or family along the journey. Another 140 migrants

(6%) wished to create a business or return to their business, 77 migrants (3.3%) mentioned family/ relatives in the desired destination country, and 59 migrants (2.5%) were traveling to start new studies/ training or resume current studies or training. Additionally, 42 migrants (1.8%) mentioned safety as the reason for choosing their destination country.


Intended Final Destinations By Specific Reasons





Willingness to Return Home




Many migrants (49%) were unsure about whether or not to return home at the time of this survey. However, 28.8% of migrants stated that they would return home as soon as conditions permit. 13.2% of migrants said that they would not want to return home no matter how the political, economical or social situation evolves, while 5.2% of migrants said that they are not able to go back home and the remaining 3.8 % of migrants preferred not to answer.




Intended Final Destination & Reason for Travel

Number of migrants who did not know if they would be willing to return home.





Number of migrants who cited that they would return no matter what the situation is.

Number of migrants who cited that they would not want to retun home.






72.9% of migrants surveyed mentioned that they faced specific difficulties during their journey.
