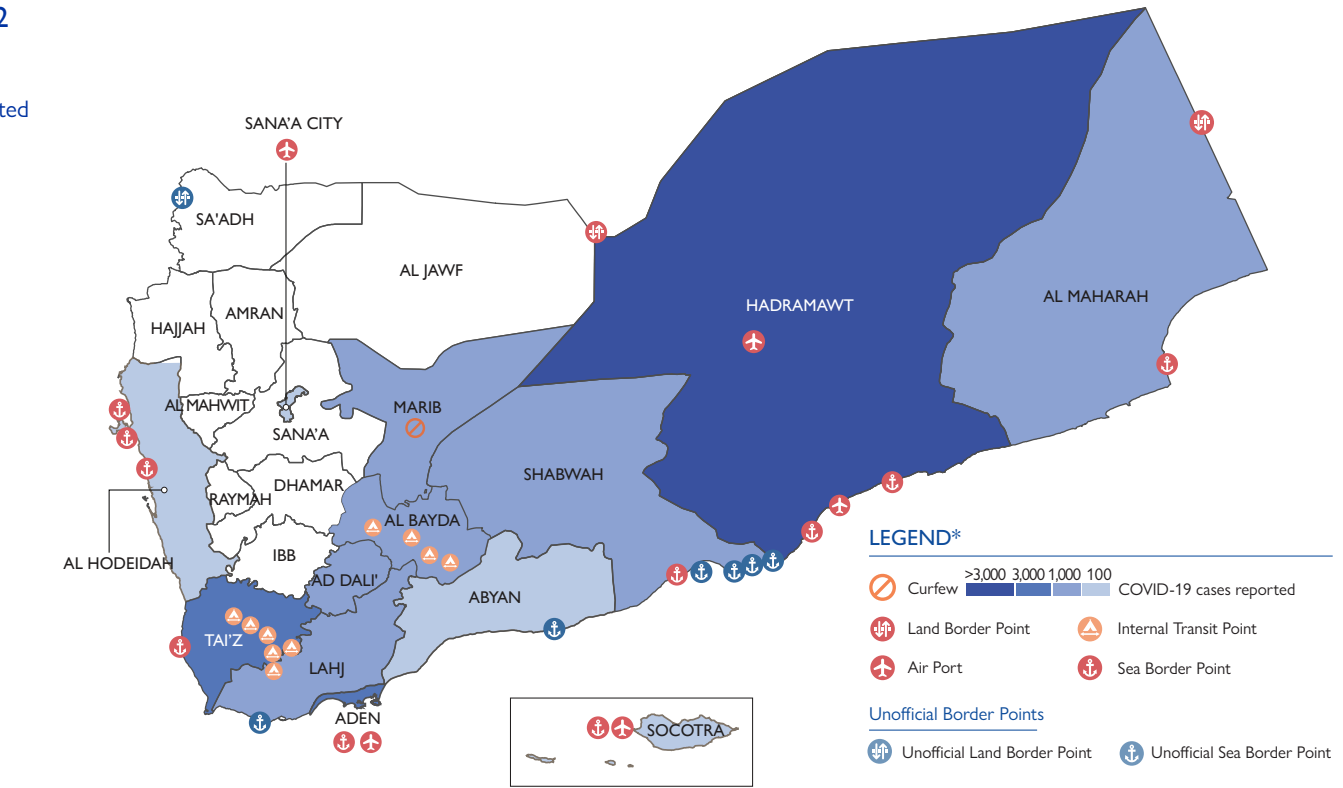

HIGHLIGHTS (From 01 to 28 February 2022)

- 750 new cases – 123 new deaths | source: [WHO](https://www.who.int)
- Updates on numbers of new cases in areas controlled by the De Facto Authorities (DFA) based in Sana'a are not available.
- 8,358 non-Yemeni migrants arrived at the Yemeni southern governorates of Lahj, Shabwah, and Hadramaut and 4,685 Yemeni returnees arrived in Yemen from Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (KSA). [\(Please see February FMR report for more details\).](#)
- No IDP households (HH) reported COVID-19 as the reason of displacement. So far, the total number of IDP HHs who have cited COVID-19 as the primary reason for displacement is 1,559 households.
- On 16 Feb In a meeting chaired by PM DrMaeenSaeed, Supreme National Emergency Committee decided to allow fully vaccinated individuals to enter the country without a PCR test in light of the remarkable decline of reported COVID cases.

Mobility Restrictions

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the local authorities of Yemen declared a nationwide health emergency and introduced many preventative measures similar to those adopted by the rest of the world starting in March 2020, in order to reduce the transmission of the virus. The Yemeni authorities had put additional preventive measures and health screenings for people passing through ten transit points used for public movement between southern and northern governorates, specifically at points located in Taiz and Al Bayda. These restrictions have been loosened and the health screenings have been removed. For Yemeni returnees from KSA travelling through Al Wadeah border point and from Oman travelling through Shahin border point, providing a COVID-19 PCR test report is mandatory. Fifteen sea border points and three land border points are reopened for movement.



- The movement restrictions were lifted, and the health screenings have been removed from internal transit points.
- Al Wadeah land border point (between Yemen and KSA) is restricted for Yemenis, only allowing Yemenis holding a negative PCR test in addition to a COVID-19 vaccination certification to enter KSA. Al Shahin land border point (between Yemen and Oman) is open; permitting entry to Yemen from Oman subject to providing a negative PCR test. Entry to Oman requires proof of vaccination against COVID-19, certified by the local authorities in Oman.
- International Airports in Sana'a, Aden, Sayun and Al Rayan reopened for international flights.
- Authorities in the governorate of Ma'rib imposed a curfew from 10 p.m. until 05 a.m. in an attempt to combat the spread of COVID-19.
