


IOM manages the Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) in Nigeria and other countries around the world to support humanitarian communities with data on displacement and mobility. This information management product determines the status, locations, and (339,362 households) across Adamawa, Bauchi, Borno, Gombe, Taraba, and Yobe states. This represents an increase from Borno State. Although, most of these IDPs still retain their status because they could not return to their actual places of abode. Assessments were carried out from the 3rd of April -12th of April 2017.




