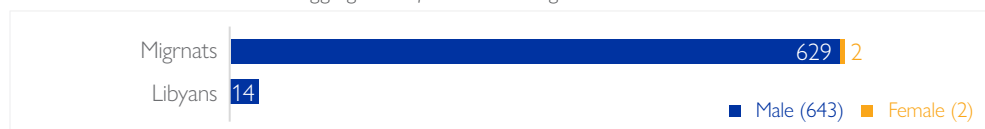


IOM LIBYA WEEKLY MIGRANT & HOST COMMUNITIES COVID-19 VACCINATION UPDATE - PHASE 3 (29 May - 4 Jun 2022)

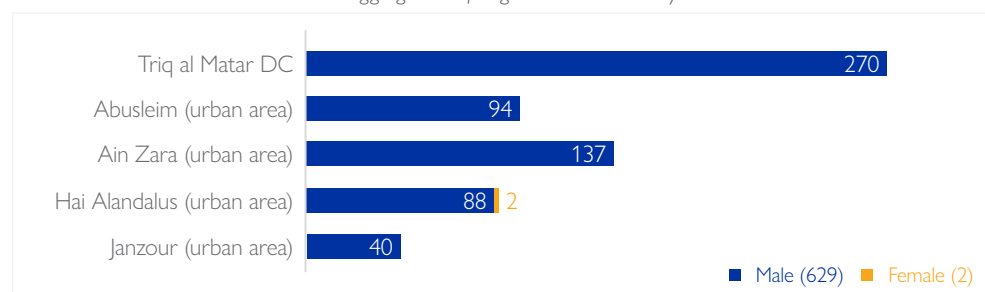
As part of the third phase of the Libyan national COVID-19 vaccination campaign led by the Libyan National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), IOM conducted awareness raising sessions on COVID-19 vaccines with a total of 232 adult migrants in two locations, Hai Alandalus and Ain Zara community settings.

Additionally, 645 (631 migrants and 14 Libyans) have received COVID-19 vaccination in five locations during the reporting period (29 May - 4 Jun 2022).

Gender disaggregation of vaccinated migrants and host communities

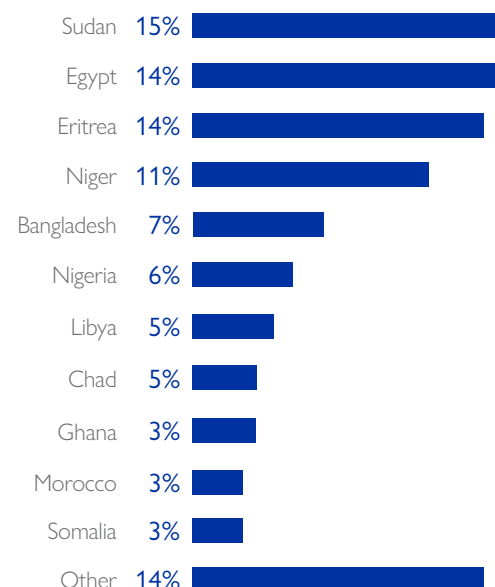


Gender disaggregation of migrants vaccinated by location



By 4 Jun 2022, the migrants vaccinated were from 38 different countries of origin, including Sudan (15%), Egypt (14%) and Eritrea (14%).

Country of origin disaggregation for migrants vaccinated

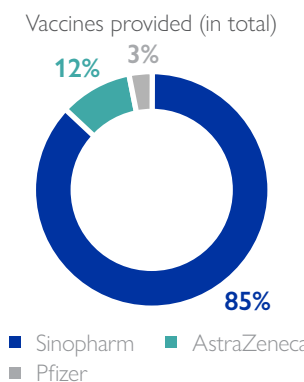

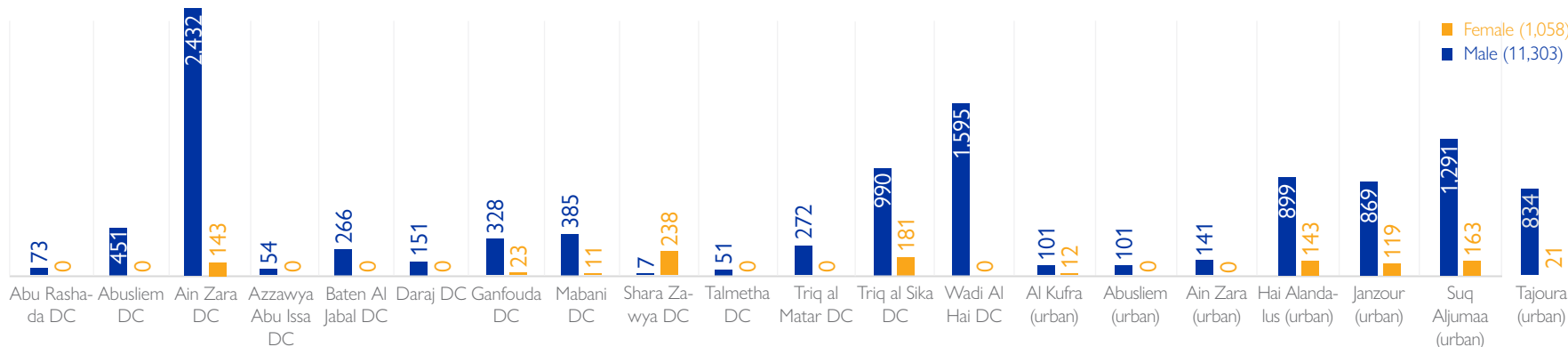

By 4 Jun 2022, a total of 12,361 persons (1058 females and 11,303 males) including 11,756 migrants and 605 Libyans, have received either Sinopharm, AstraZeneca or Pfizer vaccines, out of which, 3,249 migrants (26%) have received two doses and 610 (5%) have received three doses. Vaccines were provided and administered by NCDC.
