As part of the national COVID-19 vaccination campaign led by the Libyan National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), IOM conducted awareness-raising sessions on COVID-19 vaccines for a total of 210 adult migrants in community settings in four municipalities during the sixth week. Trained IOM community mobilizers, accompanied by medical teams provided the migrants with critical information on COVID-19 vaccines, including its importance, dosage, side effects and addressed questions and concerns related to the vaccination processes.





The migrants vaccinated were from 38 different countries of origin, including Egypt (19%), Eritrea (16%) and Niger (15%).





By the end of the sixth week, a total of 4,918 migrants (496 females and 4,422 males) have received either Sinopharm or AstraZeneca vaccines, out of which, 612 migrants (12%) have received two doses and are fully vaccinated (including the migrants who received the first dose before 3 October 2021). Vaccines were provided and administered by NCDC.
