

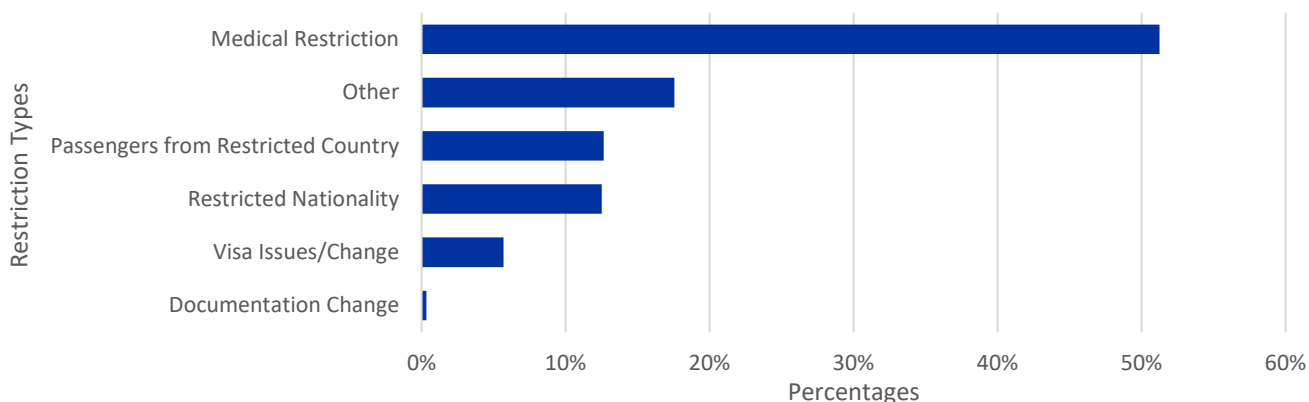
Overview:

The effect of COVID-19 on global mobility continues to reflect in both the volume and the geographical scope of countries, territories and areas, introducing related travel measures that restrict movements, and/or an intensification of health dependent travel requirements, with **1461 new measures issued in one day**. As of 13th March 2020, there were at least **5,430** known measures in place due to COVID-19 issued by 109 countries, territories or areas, an increase of **73%** from the **3879** restrictions reported yesterday. **Restriction of movements on all passengers** have been introduced by **Kuwait** and **El Salvador**. **Travel restrictions** continued to intensify through **visa invalidations** issued extended to additional passport holders, **Singapore** increased restrictions to all. The People’s Republic of China passport holders, from previous advisory limited to the People’s Republic of China Hubei province residents, and nationals from **Islamic Republic of Iran**. **Guatemala** implemented a 30-day restriction period to passengers from selected countries, territories and areas. There was an increase in the restriction period from 14 days to 21-28 days by countries, territories and areas, such as **Antigua and Barbuda, Curacao, Maarten, Turks and Caicos Islands**. **In Europe**, two new countries introduced travel restrictions or medical measures, including **Bosnia and Herzegovina** which has implemented a total restriction of entry for passengers from the People’s Republic of China, the Islamic Republic of Iran, Italy, or the Republic of Korea and **Malta** which has imposed self-quarantine for 14 days for passengers arriving from COVID-19 affected countries.

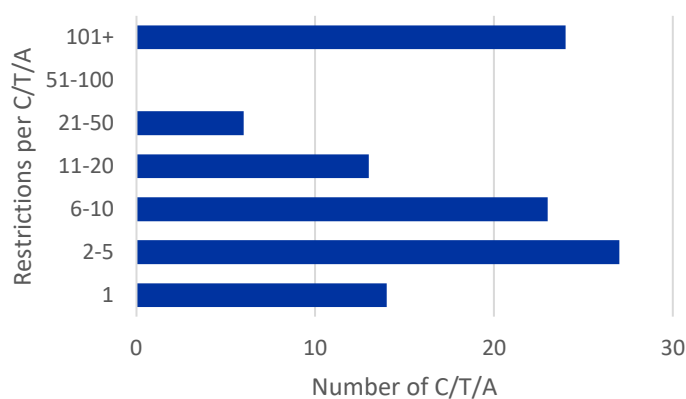

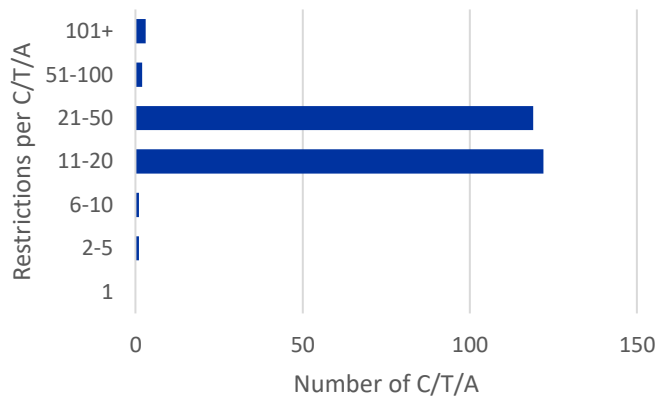
Most Common Imposed Restriction Types in %



Number of Countries/ Territories/ Areas Imposing Restrictions

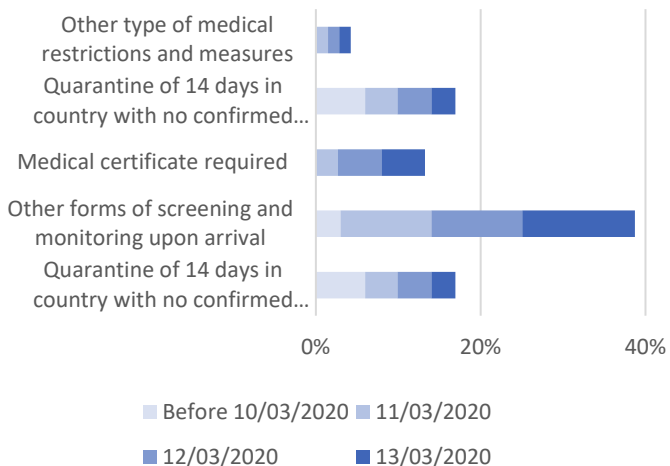


Number of Countries/ Territories/ Areas with Restrictions Imposed upon them



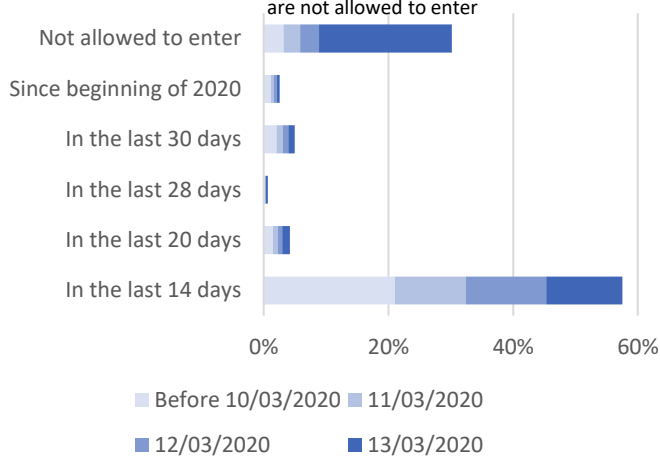
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Medical Restrictions

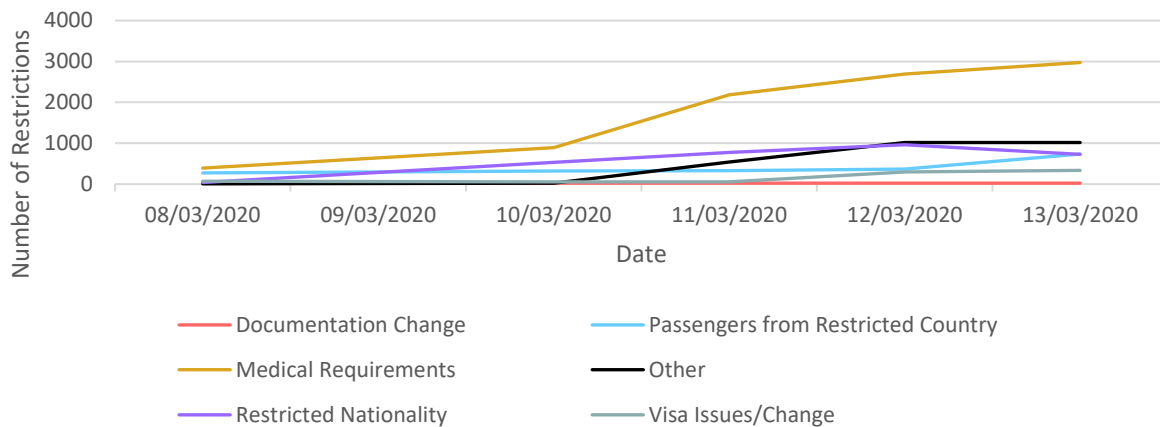


Entry Restrictions (by Date)
